

The primary responsibility is the coordination and provision of Occupational Therapy (OT) assessment and treatment for in-patients in Acute Care Psychiatry and Primary Health Care mental health clients. The primary goals are the promotion of health through occupation and education and the preservation or restoration of function needed by individuals to maintain or increase independence within their home or community

QUALIFICATIONS

- Baccalaureate Degree or Clinical Master's Degree in Occupational Therapy or equivalent.
- Eligible for membership with the Association of Occupational Therapists of Manitoba
- Eligible for membership with the College of Occupational Therapists of Manitoba.

Other Skills/Knowledge:

- a) Demonstrates skills in clinical assessment, planning, implementing and evaluating mental health and wellness services.
- b) Demonstrates skills in mental health promotion and chronic disease management.
- c) Demonstrates skills in areas specific to the Primary Health Care teams, such as but not limited to:
 - Infant/Child – child development and developmental disorders; early identification and intervention of psychosis; social risk factors; Positive Parenting Program; suicide prevention
 - Men's/Women's' – preventative and assessment screening tools; community trauma response; CODI; therapeutic group modalities
 - Senior's – Alzheimer's Disease and associated dementias; healthy aging and aging in place
- a) Demonstrated ability to participate in a program of rehabilitation medicine involving institutional and community therapy services
- b) Ability to assess and treat clients of varying ages with diverse diagnoses
- c) Ability to communicate effectively with clients and members of the health care team
- d) Excellent interpersonal and organizational skills
- e) Ability to work independently and on own initiative
- f) Valid Class V driver's license and willingness to travel
- g) Ability to speak Cree is an asset
