

The Registered Nurse is an integral member of the health care team that collaborates with all members of the multidisciplinary team in the provision of holistic care. The Registered Nurse works under the direction of and in conjunction with the Nurse Manager/Head Nurse or Resident Care Coordinator. The Registered Nurse shall practice nursing as defined by the Registered Nurses Act and in compliance with the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba Standards of Practice and the Canadian Nurses Association Code of Ethics by caring for and directing the overall care of a group of patients, residents or clients. The Registered Nurse must be able to function effectively in a dynamic and demanding environment utilizing the nursing process of assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation. The Registered Nurse as a member of the Health Care Team advocates for, provides information to, educates and supports the patient, resident or client ensuring that the highest possible standard of service is provided.

This position requires a successful completion of a Criminal Records and Child Abuse check.

QUALIFICATIONS

Formal Education and/or Training:

- Active practicing registration with the College of Registered Nurses of Manitoba (CRNM).
- Certification in basic Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), or obtain within three months of commencing employment. Maintenance of current certification is required.
- Previous recent experience/certification in identified area(s).
- Successful completion of Manitoba Cancer Treatment and Research Foundation Outreach Nursing Program.
- Successful completion of the Renal Education Program.
- Intermediate Life Support (ILS) certification.
- Successful completion of Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) preferred.
- Successful completion of Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) preferred.
- Familiarity with the Palliative Care Program.

Other Skills/Product Knowledge:

- a) Demonstrates the ability to utilize the nursing process.
- b) Physical and mental health enabling one to meet the work demands
- c) Demonstrates the ability to communicate effectively verbally and in writing.
- d) Ability to foster and maintain positive working relationships inclusive of roles and responsibilities.
- e) Commitment to continuing self-development and continuing quality improvement.
- f) Demonstrates flexibility and creativity; accepting and adjusting to change.

- g) Knowledge and familiarity with Northern health issues, culture and population to be served.
- h) Ability to speak Cree is an asset.
