

The Regional Teen Health Facilitator (RTHF) is an integral member of a multi-disciplinary team, who will promote teen health with the NOR-MAN region. Guided by the NRHA Primary Health Care principles, the RTHF will strive to improve the health status of NOR-MAN teens. This will be achieved through his/her expertise in teen health service, sexual health and harm reduction; health promotion and education; advocacy and research. Flexibility is required with regards to hours of work, work schedules may include evenings and weekends.

The NRHA endorses the Principles of Harm Reduction and as per policy, all staff working within the Primary Health Care Center will establish a context that supports individuals, families and communities in making healthy decisions directed toward reducing or containing the adverse health, social and economic consequences of behaviors, attitudes and environments that may increase risk to a person's health.

This position requires successful completion of a Criminal Records and Child Abuse records check.

QUALIFICATIONS

Formal Education and/or Training:

- College Diploma in a Health/Social Service discipline.
- Two years experience in a Health or Community Services field.

Other Skills/Product Knowledge:

- a) Understands cross-cultural and aboriginal teen health issues
- b) Understands the principles of community development and capacity building
- c) Capacity to work effectively with a team of professional service providers
- d) Organizational and time management skills.
- e) Effective verbal and written communication skills
- f) Computer literacy including Microsoft Office skills and internet research ability
- g) Ability to work with minimal supervision using own initiative and judgement
- h) Physical and mental health to perform the duties of the position.
- i) Valid driver's license and willingness to travel in the region throughout the year
- j) Residence in or relocation to the service area is required.
